This is an important conference In the light of area reviews, the Ofsted CIF and 16-19 study programmes, fair funding, loans, apprenticeship levy, commissioning, institutes of technology, localism and wider access to Higher Education. College and School Leaders need to reflect on their role in offering an appropriate range post-16 provision that meets the needs and aspirations of Brent's young people and residents as well as the wider London community.

The conference will raise awareness about the changes post 16 allow questions about the implications for post 16 providers across Brent and start the process of building alliances to provide education, training and progression routes for those post 16 learners in NW London.
