GETTING HERE BY

Road

From the North:

Head onto the M1 Motorway and exit at junction 1 Staples Corner, follow the signs for the A5/ Edgware Road towards Kilburn/Cricklewood. This will lead you onto the Cricklewood Broadway where the hotel is located.

From the South

From the M25 head onto the A406 North Circular towards Brent Cross, upon reaching Brent Cross you will need to exit onto the A5 Edgware Road towards Kilburn/ Cricklewood. This will lead you onto the Cricklewood Broadway where the hotel is located.

Clayton Crown Hotel London has 41 parking spaces onsite.

Parking charges apply:

Tube

Both Kilburn and Willesden Green tube stations (Jubilee Line, zone 2) are approximately a 10-minute walk from the hotel:

Bus

Cricklewood is served by bus routes 16, 32, 189, 266, 226, 245, 260, 316, 332, 460 and C11, plus night bus routes.

The 189 and 16 are 24 hour services

Train

There are three national rail stations within a five-mile radius of Clayton Crown Hotel London Hotel: Paddington; Marylebone; and Kings Cross.

Additionally, an overground direct train service runs via the Thameslink from St. Pancras Station to Cricklewood and Silver Link Metro services stop at nearby Brondesbury Station.
